Chuck Meadows was hired as the Director of Fiscal Policy as part of an ongoing reorganization of the City of Atlanta Finance Department ordered by Mayor Shirley Franklin. He presently serves as Acting Budget Chief for the City. Mr. Meadows is responsible for the oversight and management of the financial and policy analysis functions within the Office of Budget and Fiscal Policy. He also assists the CFO in the direction of the City's financial resources and administers the functions of budget development and analysis.

Mr. Meadows' experience prior to assuming his current role spans a variety of policy areas. He helped design improvements to the National Parks Service budget and management processes as a consultant to the US Department of the Interior. His assignments in that capacity included stints at Yellowstone and Denali National Parks, and resulted in a better understanding and presentation of the maintenance backlog and budget shortfall within the system.

Mr. Meadows' served as Deputy Policy Director to former Georgia Governor Roy Barnes, where he negotiated a landmark agreement with the US Department of Energy to secure federal funding for geological monitoring of waste materials processed and stored at the Savannah River Site nuclear facility. He also led the team that designed and created the OneGeorgia Authority, a billion dollar organization designed to support cooperative development efforts in economically challenged regions of the state.

Mr. Meadows worked in the private sector as a Managing Consultant for Ernst & Young, LLP in their State and Local Tax practice. While with Ernst & Young, Mr. Meadows negotiated agreements between private sector clients and government jurisdictions.

He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Relations from Morehouse College, studied as a Donald Stokes Fellow at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs, and earned a Master in Public Policy degree from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government with a concentration in Environmental and Natural Resource Policy.
